



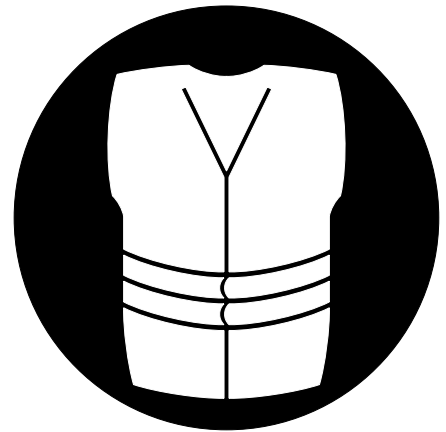

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT TORSO AND ABDOMINAL

Some jobs require working with hazardous materials or in hazardous environments. In these cases, it's important to wear personal protective equipment (PPE) to reduce your risk of injury.

CONDITIONS THAT REQUIRE BODY PROTECTION

- Working with sharp knives or power tools
- Extreme weather conditions
- Working with radioactive materials
- Contact with intense heat, including molten metals and other hot materials
- Contact with infectious materials, blood or bodily fluids
- Contact with pesticides or other chemicals
- Contact with rough or abrasive surfaces



TYPES OF PROTECTION

- **Aprons:** Usually worn when handling hazardous liquids or materials, or when working near molten metal
- **Coveralls:** Should be used when handling chemicals that can burn the skin
- **Jackets:** Used in cold weather conditions to protect from cold temperature injuries
- **Body suits:** Protect against burns or chemical spills that are harmful to skin
- **Welding jackets:** Worn by welders to prevent injury from sparks or cuts
- **Fire-resistant clothing:** Used when dealing with fires or situations with a fire risk
- **Heat-resistant clothing:** Used for extreme heat situations; includes cooling vests
- **Reflective clothing:** Used when directing traffic or for night work



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
