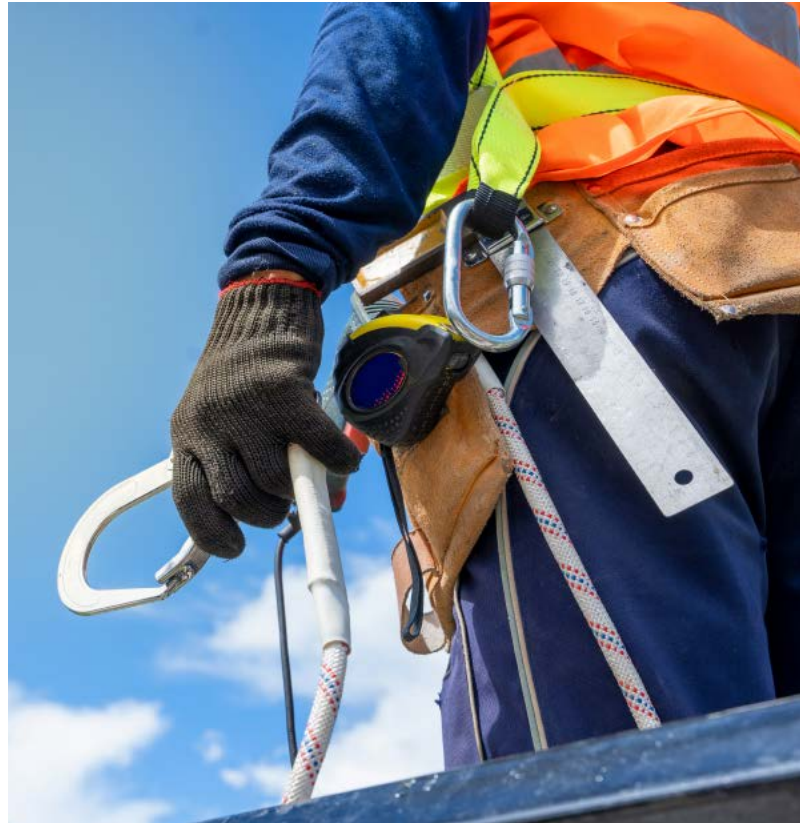

## FATAL WORK INJURIES<sup>iii</sup>

- 21% of fatal work injuries were contractors
- Out of 4,779 worker fatalities in private industry, 1,008 (21.1%) were in construction
- Over 100 workers are killed every week on the job, on average

## CONSTRUCTION “FATAL FOUR”<sup>iv</sup>

Responsible for nearly 3 out of 5 construction worker deaths

- Falls
- Electrocutions
- Struck-by object accidents
- Caught-in/between accidents

## OUT OF 1,008 CONSTRUCTION-RELATED DEATHS EACH YEAR, YOU COULD PREVENT:

- 338 falls
- 86 electrocutions
- 112 struck-by object accidents
- 55 caught-in/between accidents
