KNOW THE RISKS

Between 2013-2017, about 46% of workplace homicides were committed by robbers and other assailants, while about 37% were committed by work associates and 16% by family members or acquaintances.ⁱ

In 2018, over half of the workplace homicides occurred within three occupation classifications: sales and related occupations (20%), protective service occupations (19%) and transportation (12%).ⁱⁱ

When it comes to violence in the workplace, men are most likely to be attacked by a stranger. Women are more likely to be attacked by someone known to them, such as a significant other.ⁱⁱⁱ

PREVENT THEFT AND VIOLENCE IN THE WORKPLACE^{iv}

- Keep valuables with you or locked in a desk or closet
- Check the identity of strangers in the workplace and report suspicious individuals to management
- Promptly repair broken lights, windows or door locks
- Be aware of employees who exhibit signs of potential violence, such as depression, threats or references to violence
- Encourage employees to report concerns


MAKE A BUSINESS CONTINUITY PLAN
